LAST WEEK the following information was omitted concerning our coming school bond election: the declining rate of cost for retirement of school bonds. While the rate of tax for the first year was listed, the tax rate for the second year was not given. To put it briefly, if the coming bond issue is approved the additional cost will be approximately \$0.10 per \$100 assessed valuation for only one year, after which time, it would revert to its present rate and gradually decrease each year thereafter until the bond issue is completely retired. In summation it may be pointed out that if the school bond issue is approved, Torrance plans to have three new elementary schools and one new high school, plus our present high school being modernized, for the additional cost of approximately two dollars to each home owner.


