## Contemporary Religion for The Rest Of This Century

There was a time in Christian thinking when the major attention was given almost entirely to the place of tradition and a dogmatic interpretation of theology. There are many segments of the Protestant Church which still cling to this older method of interpreting religion. There is no need for apology regarding this older method, neither is there any fear in becoming contemporary in our religious thinking just as nearly every one has become so in every other area of human thought and endeavor.

We believe that religion is life and in a very practical way, one's religious life ought to parallel all of human experience. Unless our religious thinking is contemporary our religious motivations become very feeble and our faith becomes irrelevant to modern situations and current circumstances.

I want to suggest three elements which are essentials to present day Christian thinking if our religion is to be contemporary. The first element is the field of theology. Modern Christianity has inherited a rich past from our fathers of the faith. We are responsible to future generations by what we do with this heritage. It is only common sense to cull from the past and the present those qualities in life and religion which are good, true and beautiful in order to make our religion about contemporary. This is the tendency in all human experience as Dr. A. N. Whitehead, the great philosopher, has indicated, that that which is true in life has a tendency to perpetuate itself. Theology then is the Christian's base of operation. This field is the systematized thought about the basic ideas and concepts of our Faith. We propose to get off the base, and radiate into all of human experience.

The second element is Christian ethics which is simply the practical application of the high principles of religion to every day life and thought. There is no more positive proof of religious faith than what can be seen in human conduct. The simple virtues and graces are achievements of Christian character. The simplicity of love, patience, honor, peace, kindness, goodness, joy, and faithfulness when achieved are the first step in the great adventure of Christian living. The next necessary step is into the wider range of human activity; the social, political, and economic world. Simple truth and virtue applied to the larger groups of society is the place and program of Christian Ethics.

The third element is in the field of the rapidly growing spirit of ecumenicity. One of the greatest tragedies in Christendom is its unfortunate division into so many sectarian parts. The present trend in Protestantism is toward a greater unity among all Churches. Such an accomplishment does not require a rigid and static constitution. The basis of such unity is the

## 'Spirit' Theme Of Lesson at Science Church

"Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." This declaration by Paul in his second letter to the Corinthians is the Golden Text of the Sunday Bible Lesson on "Spirit" in all branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston.

Paul said in his letter to the Romans: "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death. . . . For they that are do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit the things of the Spirit. . . . But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his."

In Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures, Mary Baker Eddy says: "The belief that Spirit is finite as well as infinite has darkened all history. In Christian Science, Spirit, as a proper noun, is the name of the Supreme Being. . . . Man is spiritual. He is not God. Spirit, if man were Spirit, then men would be spirits, gods."
