was part of his
farewell ad-
dress 1796.



Honesty in thought is a seed that grows into honesty in action. Honesty in action grows into public esteem. Public esteem grows into legend and that remains forever.

George Washington was scrupulously honest in his private affairs; what he promised he meant and did. His thoughts were lofty and his behavior followed their pattern. He believed in honesty of thought, action and deed. He failed as a horse-trader and succeeded as a neighbor; he hated sham, pretense and demagoguery, at ostentatious falsehoods and mark of cowards. He held that honor and sincerity were paramount to a good Christian life.

He is remembered for what he did, but he should also be remembered and revered for what he was—a honest gentleman.
