AMENDING ORDINANCE No. 488
 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE No. 388.
 The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby amend Ordinance No. 388, entitled "An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Torrance Fixing Salaries and Final Stages of Official Bonds of City Clerk and City Treasurer" are hereby amended to read in their entirety as follows:
SECTION 1. That the salaries of the City Clerk and City Treasurer of the City of Torrance shall be respectively \$250.00 and \$150.00 per month, effective April 10, 1950, and throughout their respective terms of office.
SECTION 2. The penal sums of the official bonds of the City Clerk and the City Treasurer of the City of Torrance shall be respectively \$10,000.00 and \$5,000.00, effective April 10, 1950.
 This Ordinance shall take effect on the 10th day of April, 1950, and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.
