State Income Tax Deadline Nears

On a motion made by Councilman George Powell, Chamberlain is to present a prospectus on a new line to serve West Torrance residents living adjacent to Hawthorne boulevard.

Under Powell's suggestion the Torrance-Hawthorne line would terminate at Hawthorne and Redondo Beach boulevards.

VETS ASKED TO HAVE PATIENCE

Miss Helen Dill of the Torrance Veterans Service Center wants to remind veterans of a request received from the VA Regional office that veterans expecting NSI dividends do not write or call the Regional office because distribution of checks is handled entirely from Washington, D. C.

While dividend checks are generally mailed out earliest on serial numbers whose last three figures are lowest, there are many exceptions. Included in exceptions, for example, are applications that arrived after certain cut-off dates, thus putting them in a later category from those with similar numbers arriving earlier.

Veterans who are entitled to dividends will get them before June 30 at the latest, according to VA Central Office, but low serial numbers do not always mean earliest receipt of checks.

A former member of the U. S. Navy, Corporal Womack joined the Air Force in May, 1949, and left for the Philippines last month.


