


# ARABIAN GRAPPLER HERE TO TRY A ZAHARIAS

### Jimmy Murphy Out of Game For Season

The Tartars won a ball game. It was their first win of the season.

And a good one. They did it to Santa Monica, 3-0.

Blanked them three to zero last Thursday.

But it was costly. Jimmy Murphy, star second baseman and top hitter with a season batting average of .550 suffered a factured ankle sliding into second base and is out of the game for the rest of the season.

Doctors say he'll be back for the football season, though, when Football Coach Eddie Cole says he should be one of the fastest running halfbacks he has ever had.

Baseball Coach Cliff Graybehl says that in spite of Jimmy's terrific hitting record of .550 in the seven games the freshman has played this season, and 500 in the two league games he has played, he is going to miss the boy most on that second base where his wing arm has been extremely valuable in double plays.

Al Knappenberger and Jim Nady are being considered for Jimmy's second bag spot.

But that ball game.

Woodell Vaughn was hot all the way. He led the Santa Tartars to only two hits all through the game.

They didn't even get one hit until the fourth stanza.

The Tartars were so busy touring the bases that inning, it seemed only fair the north bay team should get at least a smelt.

Tad Mimura opened the Tartar onslaught in the fourth round when all the counters were made by getting a base on balls. Victor Ordaz, with two strikes against him, said he misread a bunt signal and knocked out a homer and brought Mimura in Vaughn fanned.

Jim Taylor got his first hit of the season and followed Rip to first base. Knappenberger loaded the bases on an error. Carlisle came in on a wild pitch and then it was over.

John Spiller batted for Dick Ferguson who had fanned before. And Spiller fanned right after him. The last out came when Crawford was tagged on first.
