Grave Cloth Easter Topic For Baptists





Good Friday Play Planned At Methodist Church

Everyone is invited to attend "The Terrible Meek," a one act play by Charles Rann Kennedy, which will be presented at the Methodist Church, El Prado at Manuel avenue, Friday evening, April 7 at 8 p. m.
Rev. Clarence E. Miller, pastor, commented on the play, saying: "This is a powerful Good Friday drama. In fact in 1912 the year of its premiere, it was banned in London, Berlin, and Petrograd. However, the hubbub gradually subsided and since then "The Terrible Meek" has been a regular Lenten and Advent offering in churches of all denominations. It has become propaganda for World Peace."
The speaking characters in the play Friday evening will be Charles Wallace, Fred Hamilton, and Alice Swanson. It will be maintained by Leonard Hill, Lester Foster, and Lucille Hill. Stage crew: Neil Schwab and William Atwood. Mrs. John King is the director.
Three Easter services will be held in the church with the pastor, the Rev. Mr. Clarence E. Miller, in charge of the worship services. Special music will be provided for each service with the Minister of Music, Vernon Robinson, at the organ and the regular choir of the church singing.
The first service will begin at 9:30 a. m., with the Rev. Mr. Miller preaching on the theme, "The Meaning of Easter." The second service will begin at 11 a. m. and will be identical with the first. There will be baptism of infants, children and adults and reception of new members at both morning services.
The evening service will begin at 7:30. The regular adult choir

Easter Sermonette—Central Church Minister Tells Source of His Christian Faith

"Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for he is risen as he said. Come see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead: and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him." Mathew 28: vss. 5 to 7.
Some years ago it was my privilege to visit a beautiful English garden at the base of an ugly—scarred—hill outside the city of Jerusalem. As one looked up to the brow of that hill it did not take great imagination to see its resemblance to a skull, and to accept the possibility that this might well have been Golgotha. It was easy to visualize three crosses standing there in sight of all those who passed by on the Damascus road.
It is with the central figure of those occupying the three crosses that we concern ourselves. There were and still are at least three positions that one might take as to how one regards him who hung upon the center cross. It might be, that here an impostor, or possibly a troublesome disturber was hanging, whose own folly had brought him to this terrible end. Or one might have said, here hangs a good man, but an impractical dreamer, who in a world of stark reality, is dying a martyr to an impractical plan for solving the ills of the world. But there is still another attitude, and it is this; that here was hanging the One who would prove Himself to be the victor over sin death and the grave.
It was Jesus of Nazareth who occupied that cross. In the beauty of his life he personified all that one might wish to have disclosed as to the character of God. He was placed upon that cross, from the standpoint of human factors by the greed, hatred, jealousy and treachery of sinful men. But it took that death and his subsequent resurrection to convince men that God was in Christ and that, for the purpose of reconciling men unto Himself.
In that same garden and in the side of that hill whose rock formation gives the appearance of empty eye-sockets set in a human skull there is a tomb hewn out of the rock. This may well have been the tomb which was found empty on that first Easter morning. Our Christian faith is based upon the fact that our Lord was alive and no longer dead in that tomb. It is disciples that their Master was the Lord of life and death. They who had fled when their living leader was taken captive became fearless evangelists of the good news that death could not hold Him and because He lives we shall live also.
