### 'Adam and Fallen Man' Science Sermon Topic

"When I said, My foot slippeth; thy mercy, O Lord, hold me up." This statement from the Psalms will be the Golden Text of the Sunday lesson-sermon on "Adam and Fallen Man" in all branches of the Mother Church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston.
