

Elementary Summer Classes Scheduled to Start June 19



Dates for the Elementary Summer School program were announced this week; the first session to begin June 19.

Scheduled to run through July 28, classes will be held from 8 a.m. until 12:15 p.m. in three Torrance areas—Central Torrance, North Torrance and Sea-side.

Programmed studies include instruction in the skills, namely the three Rs, and opportunities to further training in arts, crafts, music and physical cultures.

The Summer School program is supported by state aid, and is run at no cost to the school district, according to Walter Rehwoidt, director of instruction.

No transportation will be provided for students, Rehwoidt said.

"The Summer School program provides a gainful summer of occupational training," Director Rehwoidt said.

Bids Opened For Torrance Street Work

Bids for improvement of several city streets were opened Tuesday evening by City Clerk A. H. Bartlett and presented to the City Council for action.

Included in the proposed improvements are:

- Crenshaw boulevard from Redondo Beach boulevard to 170th street;
- Newton street from Hawthorne avenue to Winlock drive;
- Hawthorne avenue from Newton street to Pacific Coast highway;
- Carson street from Flower street to Crenshaw boulevard;
- Arlington avenue from Plaza del Amo to Carson street and from Torrance boulevard to Sartori avenue; and
- Cabrillo avenue from Sepulveda boulevard to Plaza del Amo.

The council referred the bids to City Manager George W. Stevens for study and recommendation.
