In withdrawing, Gray stated that he had expected veteran, labor, and party support when he filed for the office.

"This support," he concluded, "apparently has solidified behind the incumbent. In addition my private practice has required more of my attention at this time than I had expected. I therefore feel that it is proper that I withdraw. I make no recommendation to the voters at this time."
