LOCAL CHURCH COUNCIL SETS VACATION SCHOOL

The Torrance Council of Churches will hold a Vacation Church School to begin Monday June 12.

There will be a complete school in two church centers for the convenience of the children and the teachers. All children from 4 to 12 years of age are welcome to come to the school, which will be conducted for two weeks only, Monday through Friday from 9 to 11:30 a.m.

The school will be set up at the Episcopal and Christian churches and the other center will be at the Methodist and Central churches. A fine group of teachers has been selected and a very fine program has been worked out for the children.

Rev. Cecil J. England has been selected by the Torrance Council of Churches to be the Dean of the School for this year. Pre-registration will be taken on Sunday, June 4, and on Sunday, June 11, at the churches.

The three departments in the school will use the following theme for their study and worship periods: beginners, "God's Plan for Happy Homes"; primary, "Learning More About God"; "Junior, Worshipping God."

Parents will be able to bring their children to one location to leave them and to get them after the school is over.

GOD THE ONLY CAUSE SUNDAY SCIENCE TEXT

"God, the Only Cause and Creator," is the subject of the Sunday Bible lesson in all branches of the Mother Church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston. The Golden Text is from Jeremiah: "He is the former of all things; and Israel is the rod of his inheritance; The Lord of hosts is His name."

The following passages from Isaiah and the Psalms are included in the Scriptural citations: "As the earth bringeth forth her bud, and as the garden causeth the things that are sown in it to spring forth; so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring forth before all the nations." "The Lord is gracious and full of compassion . . . The works of His hands are verity and judgment; all His commandments are sure. They stand fast forever and ever, and are done in truth and uprightness."

On this subject Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "Spiritual causation is the one question to be considered for more than all others; spiritual causation relates to human progress. The age seems ready to approach this subject to ponder somewhat the supremacy of Spirit, and at least to touch the hem of Truth's garment."
