Walteria Has Opening For Substitute

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for probational appointment to the positions of Substitute Clerk and Carrier in the Walteria post office, according to R. S. Sleeth Jr., postmaster. The basic rate of pay for substitutes is \$1.065 an hour. Appointments are usually made to substitute positions, and promotions made to regular positions according to seniority of appointment.

It is not necessary to file an application form before taking the written test. Persons interested in these positions should appear for examination at 1:00 p.m. June 17, 1950 at Long Beach, Room 2, Post Office Building, Third and American streets. Application Form 60, Form 5001 BC and Form 14 for persons claiming 10-point preference, should be obtained from the Commission's Local Secretary located at Walteria, Calif., post office and must be filled out and brought to the examination room.

No experience is required. Applicants must qualify in the written test.
