### Summer Sessions Open With 600 Enrollment

With the opening of summer school on Monday, more than 600 boys and girls, exceeding all expectations for enrollment, will enroll in classes at Torrance, Seaside, and Perry Elementary schools, according to Walter Rehwoldt, director of instruction.

Due to a lack of interest and a low enrollment, there will be no summer school for high school students.

The summer sessions will be held five days per week for the next six weeks. The daily sessions will begin at 8:00 a.m., except at Seaside where school will begin at 8:30 a.m. in order to accommodate Walteria and Riviera students who will ride the city bus to the school.

The program has been planned to provide for a well-rounded educational experience. Activities will include reading, oral and written language, arithmetic, music, art, and physical education. Special instrumental music will be offered at each school daily to pupils enrolling for such instruction. These classes are also open

to pupils who are not enrolled in the regular summer school.

### Steel Furnaces Get Anti-Smoke Installations

The program of installing air pollution controls at the plant of Columbia Steel Company here is well under way. Alden G. Roach, president of this U. S. Steel subsidiary, announced yesterday.

The project involves the installation of electrostatic precipitators to the outlets of each of the four open hearth furnaces at the Torrance plant.

The precipitators will gather the film or the solids out of the open hearth gases by passing through a discharge flue from the open hearth furnaces to a large boiler which will cool the gases from some 1300 degrees Fahrenheit down to 500 degrees, Roach said.

The gases are then passed on to the ducts of the electrostatic precipitator where solids are collected. Each day the ducts are shaken down into a hopper allowing the chemicals to be discharged into a dump.




