open for future negotiations with the city, however.

All members joined in expressing the opinion that the recreation program was important but that the first responsibility of the board was to educate the child.

Dr. Hull, in asking that the city not lean too heavily on the school board in 1951-52, claimed that the city had several ways of raising money where the school trustees were limited by law to a tax rate of \$1.65—a level already reached by the school district.

City Manager George W. Stevens admitted the city is 7 cents under its allowable tax rate at the present time.

The school trustees are currently supporting the recreation program with an \$8500 allocation.

'Better Government Committee' Meeting Draws Crowd of Five

A meeting of the self-styled "Committee for Better Civic Government for Torrance" last Saturday proved one of three things:

1. Residents of Torrance were pretty well satisfied with the city's government.
2. There was little cause for demanding a grand jury election investigation; or
3. Somebody is attempting to keep the temper in the teapot still boiling.

Last Saturday's meeting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Addis Thomas, 22401 Ocean boulevard, brought out an assorted delegation, including five members of the committee, three councilmen, and a Torrance Herald reporter.

Causing some embarrassment by their arrival were Mayor Bob L. Haggard and Councilmen Willys G. Blount and Harvey B. Spelman, Jr.

After an hour of awkward conversation about carnations, how to make a fence from telephone poles, and real estate values in Palos Verdes Hills, the "meat" of the meeting was presented for consumption.

The real purpose of the "meeting" developed with the presentation of a letter by Howard Percy.

The letter, claimed by Percy to be a copy of one to be signed by those present and sent to District Attorney Simpson, asked the D. A. to call a grand jury investigation of the last city election.

Among those who signed the original document was Marie Louise Alvis, editor of the Peninsula Press.

The reporter for the Herald was denied the privilege of seeing the original document, although he was specifically invited to the meeting.

The meeting began to break up with the departure of the Mayor and the two councilmen who declined to sign the grand jury demand.

Ficket stated that Kazarian's offer apparently assured the maximum safety and yet resulted in the least inconvenience to nearby areas.
