Billy Parton, Ex-Tartar Grid Star, Graduated

Billy Parton, Tartar grid great of 1940 and 1941, was awarded an A. B. in Physical Education in the annual commencement exercises at San Jose State College last Friday.

Parton, captain of the Golden Raiders football team in 1948, inked a contract with San Jose last year to coach the Fresh backfield while finishing school. He had ended his eligibility to play the year before.

While playing on Tartar teams in 1940 and 1941, he was outstanding among high school grid stars in the Southland.

He was named by the All-Southern California Board of Football as the outstanding high school player of 1940, and was given the Helms Athletic Foundation award for that year.

He made All-Marine League teams both years. The Tartars were then playing in the Marine League—they did not join the Bay League until after the war.

Weighing only 155 pounds while playing for San Jose, he was a spectacular ball player and won honors on the CCAA team and on the Little All-Coast squad.

Parton's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Coy Parton, live at 734 Sartori avenue. They attended the graduation exercises at San Jose.


