Local High School to Benefit from Gardena Site Sale

Reporting on the expenditure of funds derived from the sale of the high school Bonds authorized in June 1948 and from the sale of the Gardena School site, the Board of Education this week revealed that only the money from the Gardena property sale remains undistributed.

The sum, \$47,860, was added to the high school fund by the sale of a 10-acre site belonging to the Torrance Unified School District and which was sold to the Los Angeles System for use as an agricultural training site by the Gardena High School.

The money will be used to rehabilitate the Torrance High School, including painting of the interior and exterior to be started within the next ten days, according to Emmett W. Ingram, business manager of the school district.

\$70,000 Earmarked for Cafeteria at Fern Avenue School

Torrance Unified School District Board of Education this week reported on the expenditures of the \$1,504,000 School Bond passed by local residents in June of 1948.

Of the \$1,332,000 for elementary purposes, the board had on hand as of May 31, 1950 the sum of \$310,979.96, according to Emmett W. Ingram, business manager.

Out of this sum the board has earmarked \$70,000 for a cafeteria at Fern Avenue Elementary School. The remainder of the fund is for the payment of contractor's fees for the balance due on the Walteria and North Torrance schools.

From the elementary fund the district has added three new schools, a multi-purpose unit at Fern Avenue, additional classrooms for the Perry School and \$140,000 for equipment.
