Swim Instruction Program Begins

A seven-week swimming instruction program at the newly opened Alondra pool will get under way today, according to an announcement made this week by the Recreation Department.

Buses will make the rounds of the playground areas each Tuesday and Thursday morning and return in the afternoons. Children participating in the program must be at least six years of age, according to Frank Carpenter, superintendent of recreation.

Transportation cards good for the seven-week program may be purchased for \$2.85, Carpenter said. This represents a cost of 20 cents a round trip, he said.

Buses will pick up children at the playgrounds on the following schedule each Tuesday: Seaside-El Retiro—9 a.m.; returns 1:45 p.m. Waverly Park—9:45 a.m.—returns 2:30 p.m. Torrance Park and Fern—10:30 a.m.; returns 3:15 p.m.

The Thursday schedules will run on the same hours, but the pickup times for Torrance and Fern parts will be switched with Seaside-El Retiro schedules.

Instruction will be given to non-swimmers at the pool, while swimmers will be able to take advantage of advance swimming classes. All instruction will be under the direction of two Red Cross swimming instructors. Four county lifeguards, along

Golf arguments occurring at Club Alondra's new \$60,000 dining room, bar and patio, being added to facilities at Alondra Park Country Club, will be easily settled.

Included in the structure, an 80 by 70 foot one-story pumice block and redwood building, will be an indoor patio that will have an 18-foot square putting green. Diners will be able to watch putting matches through glass without leaving their tables.

Gomer Sims and Cecil B. Hollingsworth, co-owners of the Alondra Park course as well as Meadowlark near Huntington Beach, and O. W. "Spud" Moorman, who will serve as manager, will operate the new unit. The club will serve the Alondra area as its "19th hole."

Because of county restrictions on the golf course proper, the club is being constructed on five lots directly across Prairie avenue from the club entrance. A dining room which will accommodate 150 persons, with complete food and beverage service, is planned. A suitable parking area also will be available.

Construction started late last month and is expected to be complete by September 15.

Jim Dodge, Gardens engineer, drafted plans for the structure, which is being built by Bill Herbert, Long Beach contractor.


