### Council Adopts Low Flying Ban

Adoption of a new set of flight rules by the Torrance City Council Tuesday night will serve to prevent hedge-topping by planes flying low over Lomita or approach to the Torrance Municipal Airport.

The set of flight rules was suggested by the Civil Aeronautics Authority, the Sheriff's Aero Detail, and by Ed. Dietrich, manager of the airport. Although technical in most parts, the rules ban any approach to the airport which will carry planes over the residential section of Lomita. Landing on a dirt runway at the east end of the paved runway was banned also to prevent "buzzing" of homes in the area.

Non-flying was outlawed unless by written consent of the airport management.
