'For the third time in ten years, the United States Marine Corps has tapped Sgt. Buckalew on the shoulder to tell him they had a job for him to do. Out of the Regulars in 1941, after doing a peace-time hitch and then another which took him to Saipan, the Marianas, Guam, and other places still red with the blood spilled in World War II, Sgt. Buckalew went back to duty with the leathernecks on July 31.

The day Buckalew kissed his wife, Dorothy, a telephone operator in the Torrance exchange, a parting farewell, the sergeant's two boys dug down among their daddy's war souvenirs for his scrap book. They used to bring it out to show the kids in the neighborhood the pictures of their Marine Corps dad, a dog tag dangling from his neck, standing on a glaring, car-alike wreath beak somewhere on some Pacific Island.

'Out of the war souvenirs, too, came a little flag with a single star in the center - intended to be hung in the window of their home, 1711 West 336th street, to show that this home had a man away to fight a war.'
