L.A. Council Agrees With Freeway Route

Los Angeles City Council voted 11-2 last Friday in favor of the State Division of Highway's recommendation of the proposed route of the Harbor Freeway from Olympic boulevard in Los Angeles to Battery street in Wilmington.

City Manager Succeeds Rippy on Water Board

City Manager George W. Stevens was appointed by the mayor at a meeting of the City Council August 8 as a member of the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Water District.

Stevens replaces Charles T. Rippy, local attorney, who tendered his resignation Tuesday night. He said the pressure of his private practice prevented him from giving proper attention to the Water Board matters.

The route agreed upon by the council and the state, begins its 20.7 miles jaunt toward the ocean at Olympic boulevard just west of Figueroa street to Adams street, where it crosses Figueroa, continuing southward to 126th street, where it again crosses to the west side of Figueroa street, continuing between Figueroa street and Vermont avenue to Battery street in Wilmington.

The council passed the measure after hearing complaints and protests from a capacity audience—mostly property owners in the path of the freeway.

Durward Howes, chairman of the traffic committee of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, summed up the effect of the complaints when he offered: " . . . nearly everyone is in favor of a specific freeway, so long as it affects someone else's property."

Boys Club Leader Gets Navy Recall

Leo Wagner of 20520 Elliott avenue, director of the Grieg-Wags Boys Club and organizer of the Torrance and Lomita Boys Club band (now the Torrance Area Youth Band), has been called for active duty with the Navy, he revealed this week.

Wagner is a veteran of World War I and a member of the Organized Naval Reserve. He is an electrician. He will report for his medical examinations August 22. If Wagner is accepted into the service again, he said he would leave the Boys Club in the hands of Jim W. Hight, his assistant. Hight is also a member of the Organized Reserve and had just recently completed a cruise to South America.
