

Unrecorded Contracts May Cost Veterans Exemptions

Veterans who are buying their homes and farms on unrecorded contracts, with the title vested in someone else's name, were warned this week by Miss Helen K. Dill, counselor at Veterans Service Center that they may lose out on their \$1,000 property tax exemption if they do not take action to comply with a new state law.

The new law requires that the veteran's interest in his property must be on record in the office of his County Recorder on the first Monday in March before he can qualify for the \$1,000 exemption on the assessed valuation, for which he applies during the spring of each year.

Veterans must pay the fee for recording the contract. This generally runs from \$4 to \$6, depending on the length of the legal description of the property.

Veterans who are in doubt about their property purchase contracts should consult with Miss Dill at her office located at 1339 Post avenue, Torrance or go to the nearest Assessor's office.

MARINES' ORDERS CALL UP ENLISTED RESERVES

Orders calling up all male enlisted Marine Corps Reservists in

the ranks of sergeant and below are now going out in the mails, the Eleventh Marine Corps Reserve District Headquarters announced this week.

Affected by this call will be more than 3000 Reservists residing in Southern California and Arizona.

Orders to staff non-commissioned and commissioned officers will not be made at this time, it was learned, and instructions for these categories will be announced from Marine Corps Headquarters at a later date.

Reservists upon receipt of their orders at home addresses will be given 15 days to report for duty. Additional 15 days may be granted where extreme emergencies exist, but subject to approval by the District Director.

Reservists ordered to extended active duty from this area will be sent to Camp Pendleton or the El Toro Air Base. Individuals with no prior Marine Corps or Marine Corps Reserve training will be ordered to recruit training at San Diego.

Crenshaw Widening Sum Allocated

The sum of \$887 for approximately 5120 square feet of land to be used in the widening of Crenshaw boulevard was approved at Tuesday's meeting of the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby reported that the improved section lies between Rosecrans and 135th street, with the property in question located on the west side of Crenshaw just south of 135th street.
