

## Bowl Tickets Now Available At Chamber of Commerce Office

Twenty-three cities throughout Los Angeles County this week began distribution of free tickets for "The California Story," historic pageant commemorating 100 years of statehood for California, to be held in Hollywood Bowl for five nights, September 8 through 12.

the plans for distribution, Raymond V. Darby, chairman of the ticket committee and president of the Los Angeles County Centennial Celebrations, which with the California Centennials Commission is sponsoring the colorful presentation, said that all requests would be handled on a "first come, first served" basis and urged those wanting to attend on specific nights to procure their tickets early.

"The California Story" is an official state and county commemoration of the 100th anni-

versary of California statehood. Original wagons, stage coaches, trains and other equipment of early-day California will roll across the vast stage of Hollywood Bowl on the five evenings to present an accurate historic reenactment of highlights in the dramatic history of the state.

The famed 20-mule team of Death Valley will draw the original borax wagons during the pageant.

The Gold Rush days and the arrival in California of Father Serra, De Portola and others are among the many scenes to be dramatized.





## Deadline Near To Register For Legion Meet

Tomorrow is the deadline for Legionnaires to make preferential reservations for the 32nd National Convention to be held in Los Angeles October 9 thru 12, Convention Director Ed. W. Bolt reminded yesterday.

He pointed out that special preferences and reserved seating at all Legion events goes to those registering by tomorrow.

Meanwhile, Col. Irwin W. Minger, parade chairman, said the Legion is planning the biggest parade in the city's history to highlight the convention.

Early plans call for participation in the huge, colorful event by more than 30,000 Legionnaires from the 48 states, Alaska, Mexico, Hawaii, Guam, Italy, France, Panama, Puerto Rico, Canada, and the Philippines.

Additional units will be drawn from military establishments in this area. The parade is expected to run more than eight hours, the colonel said.

## Scouts To See Rams' Games

Boy Scouts of Greater Los Angeles will again this year be guests of the Los Angeles Rams football club for the Rams' home games, Edward Mills, Los Angeles Area Boy Scout Council activities chairman, announced today, and invitations to all units in the city and surrounding communities have been issued by the host (Los Angeles) Council.

Special tickets which will admit one adult and eight Scouts for the price of one general admission have been printed by the football club and will be issued through the Los Angeles Scout office, Mills said.

In outlining the plan of ticket distribution, Mills emphasized that all Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Explorers are to be admitted to the games free but that each eight boys must be accompanied by an adult.

Because of new league rules which drastically curtail the number of free adult passes which the Rams football club can issue, the adult would be required to pay the established general admission ticket price.

Mills stated that none of the special Scout tickets would be handled by Rams headquarters or ticket agencies but that all requests should be directed to the Los Angeles Council office, 216 Bendix building, Los Angeles 15.
