Following the parade, the "Kids' Day" carnival will be ready for the throngs on the High School grounds just west of the stadium.

Booths, activities, and concessions ranging from tests of pop gun marksmanship to dart games and three-legged races are being planned out this week by members of the Torrance Kiwanis club under the chairmanship of Dr. G. M. "Jerry" Eastham.

Kiwanis ladies will hold a bake sale, the Junior Women's club will hold a White Elephant sale, and the Lutheran church will sell coffee, pie, pop, and other carnival goodies.

In addition to all the familiar carnival, Strong's Dog and Pony Show will put on an hour show. Featured in the show are William Dedrick's World Famous

Cheeta the monkey, Toto the clown, Nello the juggler—10 acts altogether. Show times are 2, 4, and 8 p.m.

AND, the Tinker-Town ride concession for the kiddies will set up on the grounds for a day. These rides include such thrillers as the merry-go-round ferris wheel, and a small choo-choo.

ROME CABLE GRANTS SIX-CENT WAGE HIKE

A wage increase of six cents per hour for all employees of the Rome Cable Corporation went into effect Monday, September 11, company officials announced this week.

The offer was accepted by Lodge 1875 of the International Association of Machinists for all maintenance workers represented by them, John H. Dyett, vice-president, said.

Fraser, president, it was brought out that this is the seventh voluntary general wage increase that the company has granted since February 1941. The notice further indicated that the step was taken in recognition of rising living costs.
