Designed especially to aid officers and committee chairmen of women's clubs is a course in principles of parliamentary procedure to be offered in the fall semester of University College, late afternoon and evening division of the University of Southern California.

The 18-week class, which will meet weekly on Tuesdays from 7 to 9:40 p.m., offers university credit and opens September 19. Dr. Alta B. Hall, associate professor of speech, will be the instructor.

Topics to be covered will include parliamentary rules and their underlying reasons, duties of officers, committee procedure and principles governing drafting of constitutions and bylaws. 
