

# New Maps of City Now Available at C. of C.

With the names of 50 new streets added since last year, the Torrance Chamber of Commerce this week started the distribution of a new map of Torrance, according to Blaine Walker, executive secretary.

The new map lists 379 streets this year as compared to 331 streets listed in the 1949 map.

Other changes in the map include the listing of several new industries which have come to Torrance since a year ago. Among them are the Domanco Co., North American Aviation, Inc., Pacific Rubber Company and the Rome Cable Corporation.

### SCHOOLS SHOWN

Indicated by small stars printed on the face of the map are 17 school locations in Torrance, Lomita and the Shooting Strip. The population of Torrance, reported as 19,000 as the official estimate a year ago, is currently reported as 25,000 by the Chamber of Commerce.

**CHURCHES INCREASE.** This year's map reports 21 churches in Torrance compared to 12 reported in 1949.
