Council of Churches to Begin Religious Census of Torrance

A community wide religious census will be started Sunday by the Torrance Council of Churches, it was announced this week.

Census workers will meet in the First Methodist church at 12:30 p.m. Sunday for a luncheon and instructions, and they will then go to their respective districts and call at every house until a complete coverage is made.

Residents will be asked for their family name, the ages of children in the home, their church affiliations, local or otherwise, and if not a church member, the family preference. The council of churches asked the cooperation of every resident of the city to help make religious census as complete and accurate as possible.

The first area to be covered is bounded by Plaza del Amo, Crenshaw, Western avenue and the southern city limits. If citizens of this area are not planning to be home Sunday, questionnaire cards printed in today's Herald may be filled out and left at the front door, according to Rev. Cecil J. England, representing the Council.

Other sections of the city will be covered on successive Sundays.

Pastor Named For Hammerton Tract Church

Rev. Russell Ellstrom of Compton has been named pastor of the Hammerton Tract Community church, it was announced this week.

Coming to the church which was organized with a small charter membership a year ago, Rev. and Mrs. Ellstrom are the first regularly assigned ministers of the community.

Rev. Ellstrom attended the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago and the Northern Baptist Theological Seminary of Chicago. He worked several years in a Chicago rescue mission, and was a pastor in the Puget Sound area for more than two years.

Regular services are held at the church located on the corner of Elliott avenue and Millon street each Sunday morning and evening, and a Wednesday evening prayer meeting is held each week.

Rev. England To Discuss Brotherhood

Topic of the Sunday morning service at the First Christian church will be "Brotherhood Is Miraculous," according to the church pastor, Rev. Cecil J. England.

Rev. England said most of the tragedies of modern civilization are actually related to personal animosities which become so great that they spread into enough of the important areas of life that they eventually result in such conflicts as wars between nations.

The pastor plans to stress the fact that religion continually encounters the conflict between brothers, and that combatting such animosities is therefore the special task of those interested in the furtherance of Christian fellowship.

The sermon will be given at the 10:30 a. m. services, according to Rev. England.

SUBJECT STUDY TIME TOLD IN PUBLICATION

Time allotted to the various subjects in the Torrance School System was revealed this week in the periodical "Torrance Schools," official publication for the Torrance Unified School District.

Following are the times allotted each subject in the grades kindergarten through eighth. The time allotments given cannot be strictly or uniformly adhered to every day of every week, but it is the general pattern for organizing the instructional program within the classroom.

Seventh and 8th grades Industrial, Arts and Homemaking, 120 minutes per week taken from Arts and Social Studies allotment.

In the event of double sessions in grades 1, 2, 3, the daily total would be ten minutes less taken from the Social Studies area. In grades above the third, the total time would be sixty minutes less taken from the Social Studies, arts and health areas.

*Social studies includes history, geography and civics, like mathematics includes arithmetic, algebra and geometry.

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
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
