

### Good Neighbor Day Breakfast Tickets on Sale

Each bid must be submitted on a printed form furnished by the Board and must be sealed and filed in the Business Manager's office on or before Friday, Nov. 3, 1950, at 10:00 a. m. and will be opened in public at that time and place and each bid aggregating \$1,000 or over, must be accompanied by certified cashier's check for not less than 5% of the total amount of the bid provided that if only certain items of a bid are accepted, the bidder may thereupon substitute a certified cashier's check for 5% of the aggregate amount of the accepted items on his bid; and providing further that firms doing business regularly with the Board of Education may at the discretion of the Business Manager and in lieu of the above mentioned check, file with the Business Manager of the Torrance Unified School District an annual or continuing surety company's bond in the sum not less than \$5,000.00 to insure compliance with the terms of their signed bids submitted from time to time during the life of the bond.

The above mentioned check or bidder's bond shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will comply with the terms of his signed bid; and if the successful bidder fails thus to comply with the terms of signed bid, after acceptance thereof by the Board, his check or bond will be forfeited.

Other conditions being equal, preference will be given to the products of the State of California.

long as the suspended man remained away from his machine. The four days would be up at 4 p. m. on Saturday.

#### NO PICKETING

There are no pickets about the plant.

Workers in the open hearth department continued to work. The open hearth supplies ingots to the rolling mill and is thus not affected by the stoppage of production in the mills.

Columbia officials said the work stoppage was in direct violation of the union contract. Union officials disclaimed this, saying the present period of inactivity at the mill is a "union meeting."

#### "NOT A STRIKE"

"This is not a strike. It is not a walkout. It is not a work stoppage and it is not a slow-down," Finley said.

The union leader said that the present dispute has been brewing ever since the company, he claims, cut the incentive pay rates some months ago.

He charges that the company admitted on the telephone yesterday that the management was wrong. He quoted the company as saying that the union could have won a recent grievance had the matter gone to arbitration.

#### ADMITS LATENESS

Finley said the cancellation of the incentive pay occurred when the union failed to meet the time limit in filing a grievance several months ago. He admitted the union was late in the presentation of the grievance.

He labeled as a "farce" the company's current offer of incentive pay rates which are currently under arbitration.




