PUMPKIN PIE

Pastry for 9-inch pie shell
 4 cup sugar 1/2 tsp. ginger
 1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon 2 eggs, beaten
 1/2 tsp. cloves 1 1/2 cups pumpkin
 1/2 tsp. nutmeg 1 1/2 cups Carnation Milk (1 tall can)

Line pie pan with pastry, fluting rim, top bowl. Add eggs, pumpkin, and Carnation Milk. Pour into unbaked pie shell. Bake in hot oven (350° F.) 15 minutes; then reduce heat to 300° F. Continue baking 40 minutes, or until knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool.
