Permanent Group Of Republicans To Form Here

Formation of permanent Republican group in Torrance will be the outcome of the successful campaign carried on in behalf of Governor Earl Warren, according to W. H. Tolson, chairman of the Warren committee for this area. Tolson said that the California Republican Assembly had been in touch with Frank S. Selover, secretary and manager of the Warren campaign, and that plans for the new Republican organization will be announced in a few days.

"We demonstrated that we could turn a 2 1/2 to 1 Democratic area into a 2 to 1 victory, not only for Governor Warren but for Senator Richard Nixon," Tolson said.

"There is no reason why we cannot elect men to Congress and to the Assembly, instead of letting these offices go by default each election."

Selover said that, with the 1950 census figures completed, there will be new Assembly districts and new Congressional districts, and that Republicans of the Torrance area should lose no time in taking advantage of the chance to elect Republicans to office. "We cannot wait until 1952," Selover declared, "we have to start now, and mould the organization into a permanent and strong force."

Tolson suggested that party members interested contact him or Selover in regard to the matter, and that a meeting will be called in the near future.
