City Planners To Study Water Tank Request

That a request to erect a 100,000-gallon water tank in Hollywood Riviera would receive a full share of consideration was indicated this week by members of the Torrance Planning Commission.

Application for the permit will be made by the California Water Service Company, according to L. E. Carlson, manager. He said the company plans to construct a redwood tank 34 feet in diameter and 16 feet high on a plot of ground located at 505 Calle de Arboles.

Just what action the commission will take on the matter, if any, is a matter of political speculation. The City of Torrance is planning a \$2,000,000 bond issue to modernize the city's water system and just how the California Water Company's plans fit into the city's plans will certainly come in for much discussion.

The request is due to come before the Planning Commission on December 20.
