

Four Bees Named to All-Bay

Tommy Johnson, 17-year-old Torrance High School junior, was named right guard on the mythical All-Bay League Bee team last week and three other Tartarabees were among the 17 listed for honorable mention by the selection committee.

Receiving honorable mention were Shinichi Ktsuda, guard; Jack O' Cain, fullback; and Vic Ordaz, left halfback.

Completing his second year as first string with the Tartarabees, Johnson proved to be a rough-and-ready ballplayer throughout the season.

O'CAIN TABBED

O' Cain was tabbed for his performance as a linebacker during the season, and Ordaz for his speedy running and pass catching. Ktsuda was another of the league's tough guards.

"Player of the Year" honors went to John Baima, Redondo's triple-threat tailback. A sophomore, Baima led the Beehives to their first undefeated Bay League season in the school's history.

Redondo and Inglewood both placed three players on the mythical team.



Plans Approved To Form New Leagues Here

Preliminary plans to form two leagues in the area now covered by the Bay League were approved at a league meeting Monday evening, and the move now goes before the CIF council Dec. 16 for final approval.

Recommended by league officials was the formation of two six-team leagues. Under this setup Torrance would find itself in a loop composed of Santa Monica, Inglewood, Leuzinger, Redondo, Beverly Hills and Torrance. The only change from the league now in existence would be the dropping of El Segundo and Mira Costa.

In the other league would go Hawthorne, Morningside, Mira Costa, Culver City, El Segundo and one other team, possibly Bellflower or Lynwood.

Torrance representatives were reluctant to agree to the plan, saying that the '75 enrollment of 900 as compared to Santa Monica's 1700 and Inglewood's 2500, and other large schools worked a handicap on the Tartar athletic teams.

Green II, Nativity, Seaside Awarded Sportsmanship Trophies


