## Santa to Get Real Weekend Workout Here

Santa Claus is in for a busy weekend with appearances slated at five Christmas parties to be staged in the area.

An estimated 3800 local children will attend parties to be held in the Civic Auditorium, North Torrance, South Torrance, Seaside Ranchos and Hollywood Riviera.

Expected to be the biggest of the five is the Third Annual Lions Club party this afternoon at 2 o'clock in the Civic Auditorium.

Some 2000 bags of candy and fruit have been packed to be given to the crowd due to see and hear Doye O'Dell, popular cowboy singer and television emcee, entertain during today's show.

The party is sponsored by the Lions Club with the support of the local merchants and a \$225 grant from the city.

Highlighting the program will be the appearance of Santa Claus, who will enter through a huge fireplace constructed by members of the National Supply Employees Club. Also to appear on the program are Rev. U. S. Schauer and Lloyd Jones, who will lead the group in the singing of Christmas carols, Bettie Thomas and her Accordionettes and Jack Baldwin, who will emcee the program.

The affair is under the general chairmanship of Paul Diamond with Wall Schaefer and Milt Isbell heading the program committee.

Any funds remaining will be used to stock Christmas baskets to be given to needy families in the area, according to Al Ewalt, president of the Lions Club.
