his family. A reward of \$2000 will be given for evidence leading to the conviction of anyone responsible for an act of sabotage which results in damage of \$1000 or more to company property.

INSURANCE AID

In addition, the company said it will reimburse any employee up to \$5000 over the amount recoverable from his insurance for property damage arising from an act of sabotage in which GP is involved providing that the damage occurs without fault on the employee's part. Eligible for property damage reimbursements under the GP plan is any person who, in good faith, furnishes evidence in a criminal trial resulting in a conviction.

If permitted by local laws, police and other governmental officers shall be entitled to the rewards, officials said. In cases of ineligibility, the rewards will be payable to police or governmental benevolent funds according to the company's discretion.

"To protect his own life, his family and his community, the individual will be given the maximum Civil Defense training that is practicable," pledges the California State Office of Civil Defense.

County Buys Chatten's Beach Cleaning Machine

The County of Los Angeles stepped up and claimed the first mechanical beach-cleaning machine to come off the newly formed production lines set up by inventor Vic Chatten, of 1587 West 215th street, to turn out his 18-ton cleaners.

Affectionately called "Louise" (after Mrs. Chatten, Night Chief Operator at the Torrance Telephone Office) by lifeguards at the Southland beaches, where it has been demonstrated for the past three years, the huge machine can clean about 2700 yards of beach an hour.

The machine picks up, cleans, and redeposits the sand as it is pulled along the strand.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby and County Recreation Director Paul Gruendyke accepted delivery of the machine for the county, at a cost of \$24,000.
