'51 YMCA Campaign Under Way

Nearly a hundred local businessmen and youth leaders assumed temporary military titles this morning and began a concerted drive in behalf of the Torrance YMCA in the annual membership drive for that youth organization. Commanding the five military divisions of the field campaign are General Roy Peterson, Admiral John Steinbaugh, General Don Hitchcock, General A. C. Turner, and Admiral Bill Patterson. Under each of these commanders are four senior officers. Each of these officers, in turn, have four or five lieutenants under their command. The whole setup has only one objective—to raise funds to support the Torrance YMCA for another year. Goal of this phase of the 1951 campaign is \$6000, or about one-half of the total goal for the organization. The other half of the budget is being sought thru private donations by individuals and industries which have been contacted during the month of January. The field campaign, under the direction of Warren (Gold Brick) Hamilton, got under way at a short dinner meeting and peripatetic held last night. At that time, the general director of the entire campaign in Torrance, R. R. (Yardbird) Smith, told of the needs of the YMCA during the coming year. The Torrance YMCA is managed by executive secretary Milt (Swabby) Isbell, who is employed on a fulltime basis.
