GP President Protests U. S. Anti-Trust Suit

General Petroleum Corporation attorneys Mopday asked Federal Judge James M. Carter to stop any further proceedings under the anti-trust suit against the company until the government either dismisses or brings a trial a similar suit which was filed ten years ago on which the government has taken no action. Robert L. Minkler, president of General Petroleum, commenting on this move, said: "Ten years ago the anti-trust lawyers of the Department of Justice brought a suit against many of the oil companies of the country, including General Petroleum, making various imaginary charges. The suit was never brought to trial, but is still pending. "Since then, the lawyers who worked up this old case have disappeared from the scene, moving on, hopefully, to more useful work. "Last summer a new batch of lawyers cooked up another suit, repeating most of the old charges, dropping a few, and dreaming up some new ones. "We are asking the court to make the government either dismiss or try the old case before we undertake the enormous task of wasting manpower defending ourselves from the unwarranted charges in this second case."
