Collector Explains Tax Forms To Be Used To Report Earnings

Approximately two and one-quarter million persons will file income tax returns during the present filing period, it was estimated this week by Robert A. Riddell, collector of internal revenue for Southern California. Riddell was reminding all that they have until March 15 to file their 1950 returns.

Regardless of age, every person who resides within the United States, its possessions or territories, who received \$600 or more during 1950, must file a return. Two forms are available - one a short, simplified form, and the other the longer Form 1040.

More than one-fourth of the returns filed in Southern California last year were filed on the simplified form, known as Form 1040-A. This may be used only by persons whose income is less than \$5000, which income is derived entirely from wages from which employers withheld amounts for payment of income tax, or of such wages and not more than a total of \$100 of other income from non-withholdable wages, dividends and interest.

This is the form on which the taxpayer merely reports all data regarding his income; the collector of internal revenue then computes his tax, and sends a bill for the amount due, or a refund check, if the tax obligation has been overpaid through withholdings.

If a husband and wife desire to use this form, their combined income must not exceed the \$5000 limit. Furniture, if both husband and wife are employed, and desire to use this form, they are required to file jointly.

Form 1040 may be used by any taxpayer who prefers to do so. Use of the so-called short Form 1040 method is confined to taxpayers whose adjusted gross income is less than \$5000, but the source of that income is not limited, as it is in the use of Form 1040-A. The taxpayer under this method computes his tax by reference to the tax tables on the last page of Form 1040.

Red Cross Chairman Cites Need for Volunteer Help

"War is an expensive business for everyone—and especially for the American Red Cross. That is why the Red Cross will need more volunteer workers in the fund-raising campaign starting March 1."

Mrs. Gladys Weston, 101 So. Pacific, Redondo Beach, chairman for Torrance branch, this week issued this appeal seeking volunteers to help in the local campaign. Local chairmen, household workers, and clerical help to work in campaign headquarters are needed. Also persons who can drive their own automobiles in courier service are needed.

An example of the way local Red Cross commitments have increased since the outbreak of the war in Korea is the financial aid to wives and families of servicemen. Prior to last June the Los Angeles chapter had budgeted \$7000 monthly for this purpose. During the month of December \$28,000 was needed for this type of help, nearly as much as the peak load of \$37,000 per month during World War II.

Los Angeles operates the nation's largest blood service center because of its proximity to the war front. Red Cross has shouldered a major responsibility in the civil defense preparedness program in which it is planned to teach Red Cross first aid techniques and home nursing practices to at least one member of every family in Los Angeles. Provision of food, clothing and shelter to victims of bombings or other disaster is another Red Cross obligation which must be kept at peak performance due to the turn of world events.
