

Council Liberalizes Fire Chief Eligibility

Three fire captains will be eligible to take the examination for Torrance Fire Chief following liberalized requirements adopted by the City Council Tuesday night.

Accepting the recommendation of the Civil Service Commission, the Council adopted three minimum requirements: A 12th grade education or equivalent five years on the Torrance Fire Department with increasing responsibilities, and three years as a supervisor on the department.

Meeting these requirements are J. J. Benner, now serving as acting chief, Roy Winters, and Gordon Northington. An examination will be held and the candidates who successfully pass the tests will be recommended to City Manager George W. Stevens.
