Meat Packing Scion Makes Initial Solo Flight Here

Goodlooking Tommy Hornel, modest heir to a million-dollar meat packing fortune and thereby one of Southern California's most eligible swains, gave 'em all the air this week — several thousand feet of it.

Tommy, just turned 21, successfully completed his first solo flight at Torrance Municipal Airport.

A sophomore student at Palos Verdes College, which he characterizes as "terrific," the young scion has been taking flying lessons for the past 18 months from Al Trefethen, Lomita instructor.

Tom's father, Jay C. Hornel, is chairman of the board at the Hornel Packing Company, Austin, Minn. A brother, Jim, 19, started at PVC last Monday.

The tall, dark-haired aviator expects to enter the service at the end of the present school year, after which he'll enter the packing concern.

An engaging youth, and sporting, if his family will pardon the expression, a Roosevelt grin, Tom is the star pupil at the Trefethen school of flyer, education operating out of the local flight strip in a two-place, single-engine plane.

About a dozen pilots fly in the group, which centers at a hangar under construction at the field. Trefethen says he hopes to start a government school there.
