All are batting at a .300 plus clip and will give enemy pitchers many hectic moments during the season.

Torrance will enter a team in the senior division, which includes boys 17 years of age and under as of December 31, 1951, Carpenter said.

The Golden State Association operates in three divisions of play—senior, 17 and under; junior, 15 and under, and pee wee, 12 and under. Torrance will enter only the senior division.

Torrance went the route for the Warriors and spaced five hits, whiffing six and walking one, while marking up his initial Metro win. Decker was more effective for the Vikings, although he only lasted four and two-

thirds innings, he walked three while fanning seven.

The Vikings led at the end of the first frame after Catcher George Van Zant smashed a towering homer after Del Young had walked and Ben Souder had laced a double, to the center field fence.

Van Zant had advanced to third on the run-down and scored on a fielder's choice. Garner remained in the game after Viking Coach Kicks taped up his injured digit. Raia then protected his narrow 6-5 margin for the remainder of the contest.


