

**Tax Troubles Still Pester Local Citizens**

Here's a clue for this who thought their tax troubles were solved when they hurried to the postoffice late last Thursday evening with their tax returns.

Thomas H. Kuchel, chairman of the Franchise Tax Board (that's the California equivalent of the collector of internal revenue), reminded residents that the deadline for state returns comes up April 15.

Single persons with net incomes of more than \$2000 and married persons with combined incomes of \$3000 or more are required to file state returns.

The state income tax office at 19 Pine avenue, Long Beach, is open daily from 8:15 a.m. to 5 p.m., and until noon each Saturday to assist taxpayers with the preparation of returns, Kuchel said.
