





## Post Office To Halt Sale Of Postal Notes

Sale of postal notes will be discontinued at the close of business Saturday, it has been announced by Postmaster Clara Conner.

The discontinuance of the sale of these notes is being effected to prepare for the issuance of a new type money order on July 1, Mrs. Conner said.

Until the new money orders become effective, the present money orders will be used. Purpose of the new method of transmitting money, Mrs. Conner said, is to do away with the old system of indicating the issuing office, and the office on which the money orders are drawn. The new orders will be redeemable at any post office in the United States or its territory without additional charge, she said.

The Torrance post office has asked permission to keep the money order window open until 5:30 each evening instead of closing at 5, according to Lou Deininger, assistant postmaster.

## 'Atom Strikes' To Be Shown at Civic Auditorium

The film "The Atom Strikes" will be shown in the Civic Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, April 23.

The Kiwanis Club of Torrance is sponsoring this community showing of the film along with the Civil Defense program of the local government. The Torrance Chapter of the American Red Cross, the Veterans' Organizations, and other service clubs of Torrance.

George Powell, assistant director of Civil Defense for the City of Torrance, will preside at the meeting.

Dr. B. M. Brundage, chief of the health section and assistant project director of the atomic energy project at UCLA, will be present for comments and questions.

Dr. Brundage was former plant medical officer at the Wilmington, Delaware and Oak Ridge, Tennessee atomic energy plants. He was also a member of the Japanese Survey Party in 1945 and chief of the Medical Division of Manhattan Engineer District and the Atomic Energy Commission 1946-1947. He was in the United States Army from 1944 to 1947.

This film is the latest word on atomic energy and is interesting and informative on what happens when an atom bomb strikes.

## Hundreds Turn Out for City's Easter Egg Hunt

The city's three successful Easter Egg hunts held last Saturday for the small fry has prompted recreation department officials to announce that the hunt will be an annual affair from here on, and that plans are already being made for next year.
