**Large Number of Ills Traceable To Poor Posture**

The most neglected structure in the United States today is the human body, according to Dr. R. A. Larson.

Dr. Larson's statement was made in connection with local preparations for the National Chiropractic Association's annual sponsorship of National Correct Posture Week, May 1 to 7. "The Government pours millions upon millions of dollars into a program to eradicate shuns and deteriorating tenement districts which are breeding places of both mental and physical disease," said Dr. Larson. "but aside from the circularizing of some pamphlets, what are we doing for the millions of persons living in dilapidated body structures? And imperfect bodies, research is showing, breed even more mental and physical ills than the nation's slums, because of the insidious manner in which incorrect posture works."

Dr. Larson explained that the lungs, the heart and circulatory system, and other vital organs are affected by poor posture. Incorrect standing, sitting, and sleeping habits not only inter-

fer with the performance of normal health duties by the vital organs, but also impoverish their nerve supply as misaligned vertebrae (which later may manifest in spinal curvatures), pinch nerves and diminish the flow of energy to the various organs and tissues.
