

**Ex-Fireman, Now in Japan, Challenges Author of Letter Rapping Army**

Sendai, Japan

Editor: I do not know if you will publish this, but here is hoping that you will. It is in regard to a letter that you received from this battalion.

First, I want you to note that the signatures on that particular letter were those of sergeants, and most of them are from our Headquarters and Service Company. Also note they are veterans and that they did on their own free will sign up in the National Guard for three years for better or for worse. I listen to them each day and their complaint is this:

"We are vets. We should not be here."  
What they really mean is this:

"I signed up in the guard to draw government money every three months, but now I do not care to pay for it!"

What I am really driving at is this: These men are sergeants, one a first sergeant, and they are setting a very poor example by writing such a thing. The letter to my knowledge is untrue. The men who are unfit for service (line) are being weeded out and given jobs they can perform. They (the sergeants) spend most of their time finding out a way of beating this army and pointing out the mistakes that the army makes. All this is done in front of the men, consequently the morals is very low in the battalion.

My impression of a non-commissioned officer is (and always will be) that he must be able to receive and obey orders. Also to see that the men are taken care of. This particular group (all from the Torrance area) have been very selfish and thinking of no one but themselves.

If it is signatures that are needed, I shall get the backbone of the army to sign—the private!
