**New Cocktail Lounge
Opened at Daniels**

"Cozy" is the word for Charlie Gotts' new 10-stool cocktail lounge which is celebrating its "official" opening this week end.

The new bar, done in the west-

ern motif in keeping with the cafe owner's Rancho Room, has its entrance on Cabrillo avenue between the bus depot and the main cafe entrance.

Manager of the new cocktail lounge is Wayne Davis, a resident of Torrance for the past seven years, who has made a career (and a quite a reputation) of making fine Martinis.

Hours for the bar will be from 10 a.m. until the usual closing time of 2 a.m. Drinks of all kinds are offered at popular prices.

The new cocktail lounge is the third expansion undertaken by owner Gotts since December of 1949 when he opened the Rancho Room, popular dining spot. In April of last year Gotts revamped part of the cafe at 1625 Cabrillo avenue to provide a bus depot for Torrance Municipal and Greyhound Bus lines.

Corporal, Twice Wounded, Recovering in War Zone

Recovering from his second wound in Cpl. Robert L. Curtis, 21, of 1533 Sepulveda boulevard, who was hit in the head and suffered body lacerations while fighting with the U. S. Marines above the 38th parallel in Korea.

The ex-Torrance High School student is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Julius N. Curtis.

Corp. Curtis was first wounded on March 23 when he was hit by flying shrapnel while dragging a wounded buddy into a foxhole. He had leaped from the relative safety of his own foxhole to aid his buddy when he was hit.

On June 13 he was wounded again while fighting 20 miles above the border between North and South Korea. He is on the mend in a hospital some 25 miles inside South Korea.
