## MEMBER OF PIONEERING MONTANA FAMILY DIES

Death claimed a member of a pioneering Montana family here this week when Mrs. Rachael Reid, 86, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. P. L. Hoffman, at 1612 Post avenue.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Morgan Evans, prominent Montana developers, Mrs. Reid was born in Brigham, Utah, October 12, 1884. Two years later she moved with her family to Montana. Her parents, originally from Wales, had crossed the North Atlantic in a sailing vessel and migrated across the North American plains by ox-cart.

She was among the first students to attend the College of Montana at Deer Lodge where she studied music. She was a member of the Eastern Star in

Anaconda, Montana, and a member of the Christian Science Church.

Surviving are her daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. P. L. Hoffman, of the Post avenue address; a grandson, P. L. Hoffman Jr., and two great-grandchildren, Phillip III, and Pamela. One sister, Mrs. Katherine Wellcome, lives in Anaconda, and a brother, David Evans, lives in Deer Lodge.
