North American Employees Get Cost of Living Boost

An additional one cent an hour cost-of-living allowance will be paid all eligible North American employees including those of the Torrance plant for the three months period beginning July 23, it was announced this week by E. D. Starkweather, director of industrial relations for the organization.

The allowance will show in checks distributed Friday, August 3, Starkweather said.

This will be the third cost-of-living allowance since the program was inaugurated last October. Two cents an hour was

given for the period from January 29 to April 23, and an additional seven cents an hour from April 23 to July 23. The additional one cent will raise to 10 cents an hour the total cost-of-living adjustment made since October.

The cost-of-living schedule calls for one cent for each 1.14 points increase or decrease in the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer's price index for large cities since August, 1950. The price index figures are reviewed each three months for the purpose of making the adjustment.

14 Courses Offered at Harbor Tech

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
