### Love is C. S. Sermon Topic

The spiritual understanding of God, Love, establishes true brotherhood and constitutes a protecting and healing influence in the lives of mankind, according to the Sunday Bible Lesson on "Love" in all Christian Science churches.

This counsel from Jude (1:21) constitutes the Golden Text: "Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life."

A Bible passage from Luke records that a lawyer asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus told him of the traveler who "fell among thieves, which stripped him of his raiment, and wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead." A priest and a Levite "looked on him, and passed by on the other side." But a Samaritan "bound up his wounds, ... and took care of him." Jesus said unto the lawyer: "Go, and do thou likewise" (10:29,30,32,34,37).

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy says "The letter of Science plentifully reaches humanity today, but its spirit comes only in small degrees. The vital part, the heart and soul of Christian Science, is Love" (p. 113).
