Also being planned is a card party in Moose clubhouse at noon on Wednesday, August 15. Cora Hill, homemaking chairman, will complete party arrangements.


Several co-workers are planning to attend the convention in Santa Cruz this week end, including Senior Regent Geneva Clawson, official delegate.


