


# Minor Leagues Battle for Crack at Dow

Dow Chemical, A League winners, remained this week the top contender for the City Softball Championship and winner of the Torrance Herald Trophy by downing Lovelady Hardware 4-1 in the second round of the Shaughnessy playoffs at the Torrance City Park Monday night.

The victors will rest on their laurels until Friday night, while B and C league winners battle it out for a chance at the A League winners.

Most probable opponent in the two out of three game championship playoffs is the Waleria Dukes. They whipped the Steelworkers Monday night and as this issue of the Herald went to press were battling it out with the weaker C league winners, the Waleria Businessmen, under the ares at Waleria. The winner of that game will meet the Dow Chemical hide-busters at the Torrance City Park on Friday night and again on Monday night. If a third game is required, the contest will be played August 16.

The trophy (now in possession of Lovelady Hardware, last year's winner) will be presented to the victors at a bean feed to be held on August 17.

Last Monday's contest started off with a bang as Andy Anderson, left field for Lovelady, successfully negotiated the circuit to score the hardware team's sole run.

Speedball Artist "Rusty" Brooks allowed but two hits. He faced 23 batters and fanned 11. Al Coast and Bucky Kuhn got the two hits off Brooks.

Dow was meeting Three M in the first game of the playoff. From the first pitch, fans knew that they were in for a pitching battle between Brooks, and Three M's Sam Sunseri. Both are among the league's top hurlers.

Two Three M batters got on base—both as the result of errors. Dow batters did a little better, they tagged Sunseri for a total of seven hits, three of them in the 12th inning.

Catcher Jim Potrat and Brooks finally broke up their game in the top of the 12th inning on an error and a homerun. Brooks got the home run.

## Extra Inning Rally Fatal To Steel Nine

An extra inning rally good for seven runs put the Waleria Dukes in line to play in the third round playoffs Monday night and sent the Steelworkers home licking their wounds.

It was a good scrap, however, with the lead changing hands more often than the proverbial hot potato.

In the fourth the Steelworkers' chucker, Charley Camou, cleaned up the bases with a four-bagger tallying Jack Caplinger ahead of him, 4-2. The Dukes came back the next inning with Mimura, Rubel and Vaughn scoring and to reclaim the lead. In the sixth Caplinger stole home and again tied up the ball game. The contest went into the eighth tied up at 5-5 but not for long. The Dukes laid the bat to the horsehide batting it all over the park to score seven runs. The Steelworkers' last inning fight fizzled.
