

Free Open-Air Concerts Slated for Bend Chapel

Josef Marias and Miranda, singers of South African and other folk songs, will open the Wayfarer's Chapel open-air concert series, free to the public, Saturday evening at 8:15 o'clock.

The concerts will be presented monthly within a week of full moon under the stars at the unique chapel located on Falos Verdes drive South in the Portuguese Bend area.

Marias and Miranda have appeared on several coast-to-coast broadcasts including the Tallulah Bankhead program, and the Meredith Willson radio show. They have recorded such albums as "Songs of the African Veldt," and "Ballads of Many Lands," for Decca and Columbia.

Although the Chapel program will feature South African ballads, the Marias also will sing American, Flemish, German, Swiss and English folk tunes. The recital will be presented

on the north side of the Chapel with the unusual glass and redwood arch church serving as a backdrop. The Rev. W. C. Broomell, Chapel pastor, said the public would be seated on a first-come, first-served basis. Persons who have contributed to the Chapel fund may obtain reserved seats by writing in advance to the Chapel. No collection will be taken at the evening program.

Since it will be an open-air program, the Rev. Broomell urged spectators to bring blankets in case of a cool evening.

Others scheduled to appear at later Chapel concerts include MaryJane Barton, noted harpist, and Gaylord Carter, prominent radio and recording organist.

45 Youth Band Members to Make 'Fiesta Journey'
